Kiwanis Meetings

Ask your sponsoring Kiwanis club if your club may go to their next general meeting! Tell them that you'd like to host a service project, and can make dog toys, bracelets, etc. with your Kiwanis during the meeting.

Thanksgiving Social

Throw a club social to celebrate Thanksgiving and at the end, have everyone make foods to donate to homeless shelters!

Park Beautification

Choose a local park for a beautification done by your Key Club and Kiwanis. Key Clubbers would work on clean-up, painting facilities, etc. while the Kiwanis would landscape or plant trees. This project would also be counted for BEE Clean CNH!

Letters to Kiwanis

Take the time out of your day to express your gratitude for your local Kiwanians. This service project is perfect for any Key Club that doesn't have a strong bond with their sponsoring Kiwanis club!

Service Auction

Attend a Kiwanis meeting and auction off officers and/or members to Kiwanians. Kiwanians can "buy" you for a day of service or a certain task that they might need help with around the house! Example: washing their car, yard work, or cooking.

Crab Feed

Have your sponsoring Kiwanis buy crabs and other ingredients, while Key Clubbers can be in charge of the advertisement and planning. Invite other Kiwanis clubs and the community to come by and eat!

Date Auction

"Auction" off certain members of your club or division to raise money for a good cause!

Kiwanis Service-a-Thon

Coordinate with a sponsoring Kiwanis division to host a "service-a-thon". A full week will be dedicated to Kiwanis-sponsored service events. For every hour completed, the Kiwanis would donate \$0.50 to the Key Club. 1. Take volunteers who are willing to be auctioned off for their service to a Kiwanian.

 Let your Kiwanians know about the event at a prior meeting.
Attend a Kiwanis meeting & conduct a member/officer auction!

4. Collect the proceeds to donate to a charitable cause.

Fundraisers

 Start by planning with Kiwanis. They should be in charge of admission, cooking crab, etc.
Advertise the crab feed to the club.

3. Have Key Clubbers volunteer as waiters.

4. Charge admission and be sure to set up enough tables and chairs for people who attend!

 This event can be hosted on top of another event or on its own.
Start off members at a small price and let people bid until the highest price gets reached.
Once a person has been auctioned off, they should spend a day with the person who won (or whatever reward the person gets).
Be sure to provide a variety of people to auction off.

 Contact your local Kiwanis Club to organize a week of events, specifying details to allow for advertising.
Advertise using graphics and emails.
At each event, account for all members and use an accurate way to count the number of hours completed to exchange for funds with Kiwanis.
Collect funds, then send proper thank you letters to the Kiwanis for

Kiwanis BBQ Bash

Bond with your Kiwanis club even more by hosting a barbeque and selling the food at a local community event! Donate all the proceeds to either your Kiwanis club, home club, or both!

Kiwanis-giving Potluck

Invite your members to a Kiwanis-giving Potluck to celebrate the Thanksaivina season! Collect a small entrance fee and donate all proceeds to a charitable cause or towards your club's savings.

Formal Kiwanis Holiday Dinner

Have your club plan a formal, multi-course meal to say thanks to your local Kiwanis Club. Have Key Clubbers work on the planning, admission, serving of the food, and cleaning up of the event. This is a great way to give back to those that make Key Club great!

1. Ask Kiwanis if they would be willing to host a BBQ bash with your club.

2. Start planning a date, time, and location for the event.

3. Publicize the event to everyone! 4. Have members from your club volunteer to serve the food while Kiwanians cook. Have beverages stored in a cooler.

5. Donate the proceeds made!

1. Find a venue that can be used. 2. Advertise the event to members and Kiwaniansand ask for a small donation as an entrance fee. 3. Plan decorations and table topics to place onto tables. 4. Prepare a money handling form to collect the entrance fee at the door.

5. Ask your advisor to help you donate the proceeds.

1. Find a venue with a kitchen and large dining room.

2. Work with an adult to plan a multi-course meal, menu, and budget. 3. Gather Key Clubbers to volunteer as waiters

4. Advertise the event to your Kiwanis Club. Make sure to mention the formal dress code for the event.

5. Collect admission cost or sell tickets in advance with the help of a chaperone. 6. Prepare meals. Involve Key Club members. Serve Kiwanis members.

- 7. Play music or have performances to keep to keep the Kiwanians entertained
- during their dinner.

8. Clean up as soon as the event is over.
